

## 2017-2018 PE and sport premium funding report

### Purpose

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. Schools receive PE and sport premium funding based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6. Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best way of using the money. <b>Impact of premium use</b>	
What has been the impact on pupils' participation?	Pupils from Year 2 upwards have had opportunities to participate in a wide range of interschool sports activities, due to the Darlington SSP. They have had opportunities to access competitions and festivals in a variety of sports. The school achieved a Silver School Games Mark.
What has been the impact on pupils' attainment?	The majority of pupils in Year 6 met the national curriculum requirement to swim for 25 metres.
How has the premium allowed pupils to develop active lifestyles?	Specialist teachers have ensured that the sports instruction at the school has been of a high quality, allowing pupils regular access to fun, active lessons. This has also allowed teachers, together with the PE planning subscription, to enhance their own skills thus giving pupils an improved sports curriculum.
How will the school sustain the improvements?	We will continue being part of the Darlington SSP and using specialist sports teachers to enhance our sports curriculum and develop the skills of our teachers and teaching assistants.
